

Advisor tips for Arts Management classes and certificate, and Music of Spain

Arts Management classes:

We offer two courses directly related to arts management, Introduction to the Study of Arts Administration (cross listed within Division IV disciplines, 175) and Philanthropy and the Arts (cross listed, 276). The introductory course, 175, is a requirement for the Arts Management Certificate while Philanthropy, 276, is an optional elective. Ideally, a student would take 175 first, though it is possible to do them in reverse order. These two courses are offered every other year. Introduction to Arts Administration, 175, will be offered in spring of 2016 while Philanthropy will next be offered in spring of 2017. A student interested in pursuing the certificate should plan accordingly.

Music of Spain, MUS 181

What makes Spanish music so distinct among European traditions? As a bridge between Africa and Europe, Spain possesses a diverse folklore that encompasses Arabic, Jewish, Celtic, Gypsy, and Latin strains. This course will trace Spain's music from the medieval court of Alfonso the Wise to Paco de Lucia's contemporary fusion of flamenco and jazz. Open to first-year students. No prerequisite.
