

# **DEGREE REQUIREMENTS BEGINNING FALL 1998 ENDING SPRING 2001**

- ✓ 128 semester hours of academic work with at least 68 hours outside of the major
- ✓ Four short term activities
- ✓ Two physical education courses
- ✓ At least 32 semester hours in a major
- ✓ At least a 2.00 cumulative GPA
- ✓ At least a 2.00 cumulative GPA in the Major/ Minor Work
- ✓ Two years of residence at Hollins University one of which is the senior year
- ✓ General Education requirements
  - Meet competencies in oral skills, mathematical skills, and computer literacy
  - Students must also complete a first-year writing course
  - Two distribution courses from each of the academic divisions

## **GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS**

### **SKILLS**

#### **1. WRITING**

- a. First-year students, during their first or second terms at Hollins, must take a course that emphasizes the development of writing ability

#### **2. ORAL COMMUNICATION**

- a. Students may satisfy the requirement through successful completion of a course designated by the University as meeting the oral requirement.
- b. A student may satisfy the requirement by requesting the opportunity to demonstrate their ability by submitting evidence of formal training in oral communication

### 3. QUANTITATIVE REASONING

- a. Students may satisfy this requirement through achievement of a satisfactory score on the Quantitative Reasoning Assessment
- b. Students may satisfy this requirement through successful completion of Introduction to Quantitative Reasoning (MATH 100)

### 4. INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

- a. Students may satisfy this requirement through successful completion of Introduction to Computer Science (CMPS 100) or Microcomputers in the Business World (CMPS 200)
- b. Students may satisfy the requirement through completion of a test administered through the computer science department
