GUIDELINES:

- A course that meets the writing requirement must be taken in the first year

- The oral communication requirement must be met by the end of the junior year
- Students are encouraged to complete their physical education requirement by the end of their sophomore year
- Four requirements should be completed by the end of the student's sophomore year
- All other requirements must be completed prior to graduation
- Students may use a single course to meet a perspective and up to two skills
- Perspectives: courses must be from at least seven different disciplines (in other words, only one subject code can be used twice to represent two different perspectives)
