The Education Department welcomes you to Hollins.

If you are considering a career in teaching, please register for the suggested courses this fall.

What level would you like to teach?

For a Virginia teaching license, you will need to take education courses in addition to the requirements for your major. See below for endorsement areas offered through Hollins:

Elementary Education (prek-6), suggested major is Psychology, English, History, or Environmental Studies

Secondary Education, suggested major should be the same as endorsement area: Biology (6-12), Chemistry (6-12), English (6-12), Physics (6-12), Foreign Languages: French, Spanish, Latin, History and Social Sciences (6-12), Mathematics (6-12), Visual Arts (prek-12)

What courses should you take fall semester?

Make sure you register for **EDUC 141: Schooling in American Society**.

This education course is a **PREREQUISITE** for ALL other education courses. You **MUST** pass EDUC 141 with a B- or better in order to be considered for admission into the education program. This course will give you an overview of topics in Education and will allow you to complete field experiences at the elementary and/or at the secondary level.

Suggested fall courses for students interested in teaching:

- 1) EDUC 141: Schooling in American Society, TR, section 1, 8:50-10:20am
or section 2, 1:00-2:30pm
- 2) First Year Seminar, TR, 10:30-12:00pm
- 3) Math Course, based on math placement test
- 4) PSY 144: Child Psychology, MWF, 11:30-12:30pm

We have two program options for you:

Option 1) Bachelor's Degree & a Teaching License

Completing requirements for licensure is like having a double major so you **MUST plan early** to complete your major (and possibly a minor), your licensure requirements for Education, and go abroad if you plan to do so.

Option 2) Bachelor's Degree & a Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT)

Students stay an extra year at Hollins as a graduate student to earn a master's degree in teaching.
