Batten Leadership Institute (pg 52) – updated course descriptions

BLI 101: LEADERSHIP SKILLS (4)

Schnurman-Crook

This course employs an understanding of leadership theories, gender issues, information on conflict and negotiation, and learning to apply elements of a theory to consult with peers on real-world cases. Students learn risks and benefits of engaging in acts of leadership and necessary sacrifices at the heart of meaningful change, both personally and organizationally. A strong emphasis is on systems and awareness of self in systems, with required student mentoring labs and groups as opportunities to learn and apply feedback skills. Open to first-year students. No prerequisites. Offered both terms.

BLI 201: LEADERSHIP PROJECT (2)

Schnurman-Crook

This course teaches theory and models of teams with practical application around project design and implementation, allowing students to form an organization and experience the life of a team for one semester. Students will complete 360 evaluations aligned with real-world skill expectations, develop personal goals with an understanding of the impact of their goal work on the team, and rotate with formal reporting and meaningful peer-to-peer feedback to strengthen accountability. This is a vital course for anyone who wants to refine their ability to engage with teams and understand them as a system, in the workforce, on the athletic field and on a more personal scale. Open to students who have successfully completed BLI 101. Offered both terms.
